For the past few years, KOM has experienced significant growth. This includes adding crucial youth case management to address substance use challenges, and expanding financial coaching. In 2023, we grew our leadership team from 4 to 6 directors. The new roles we added were Program Director for New Arrivals and Youth Services and

Development Director to support grants and fundraising.



While we still specialize in culturally specific services, and over 90% of our clients are from Burma, our programs have grown in the past 13 years to serve refugees and immigrants from around the world. In 2023 we updated our mission statement to be more inclusive for all of the communities we serve and to be more specific about the kind of change we hope to see in people's lives. We are committed to advocating for policies that promote diversity, equity, and inclusion and providing services and resources that help refugees and immigrants succeed.





## **Employment and Financial Coaching**

Mah Jabin Amiri (pictured on the right), a former participant in the Refugee Employment Services program spoke at KOM's 2023 Gala, on her immigration journey to Minnesota and how KOM's Refugee Employment Services program helped her find stable employment as she transitioned to her new life in the States.



195 were served in our workforce programs.

566 households received assistance with income supports.

3 KOM staff were trained to work as financial coaches.

82 clients obtained jobs with increased wages.

KOM hosted 9 paid interns and 41 volunteers in 2023



# 2023 Highlights Social Services

KOM staff try to create opportunities for the elderly to take part in activities and build community cohesion. By doing outdoor activities, they can bring new energy, comfort, and connection for elders who may feel isolated. In the winter of 2023, the Elders Program visited the Como Zoo Conservatory, retreating into a warm atmosphere of vibrant green.

# **Community Health**

A vital role in the continuum of care are the KOM culture brokers. Clara Tunwin, KOM's Program Director for Community Health and Social Services, said Karen Culture Brokers "play an important role in the community connecting community members to services, resources, and guiding them through difficult situations."



In October of 2023, the Karen Culture Broker Program partnered with M Health Fairview to provide the community with free flu shot clinics.

- adults and youth attended workshops on mental health and substance use prevention.
  - youth enrolled in case management, of which 50% have accessed treatment.
  - Karen faith community leaders completed training in substance use prevention.

\$857,000

successfully won in funding from the State of MN Department of Human Services for chemical dependency programming.

We added a second youth case manager in 2023 and have plans to expand case management and prevention in 2024.

# **Youth Development**

KOM's "What's Next" program is designed specifically to support and empower youth in our community. One of the most popular aspects of the "What's Next?" program is the college trips. These trips provide an opportunity for youth to visit college campuses, meet with admissions counselors, and learn about the different programs and resources available at each institution.

We have expanded our after-school Karen Club to 4 schools and seek to add more cultural activities for youth around the year.

259

youth attended after school programs, and <u>94</u>% reported that they increased positive self-identity, based on last year's data.
